WHAT'S HAPPENIN'

From the Desk of the President

DECEMBER – JANUARY LEADERSHIP TEAM

1. Due to lack of business which needed to be addressed, I canceled the December Leadership Team meeting.
2. The proposed change to Policy Based Governance is probably the biggest thing the leadership is working toward through the Governance Committee chaired by Scott Bichel. The proposed change to the Constitution was presented by Scott Bichel to the Leadership Team for approval. After some discussion and a few changes were made the proposed Constitution as amended was unanimously approved.
3. Lisa Mack and the Outreach Committee continue to formulate plans and take action to spread the Good News.
4. The Audit for 2015 was finished and presented to the Leadership Team. There were no significant problems noted, however, there were two recommendations made. One was to simplify the filing system to facilitate matching invoices to checks. The second recommendation was to have two signatures on large checks. Since we recently obtain new checks the Leadership Team will be acting on this recommendation in the future.
5. **GOOD NEWS:** The final Treasurer's report for December showed that 2016 expenses came in under budget by about \$31,000.
6. Dennis Hall, Resources Leader, brought up the possible need for installing smoke detectors in the Sanctuary with an estimated cost of about \$6,600. After some discussion this was tabled to gather more information.

ACOLADES

There are so many people that go above and beyond in their service to the Lord and I would like to recognize some of them here. There is always a danger in giving accolades because chances are good that I will miss someone who has done something really special. That is why in this part of my article I need input from you. If you have done something special or given above and beyond, or know someone who has, please let me know. This should NEVER be the reason we do something in the church --- the reason should ALWAYS be that you are doing it because of what Jesus did for you on the cross and we should ALWAYS be satisfied with the fact that Jesus knows your every gift.

1. **Linda Huning:** While I don't usually include Staff in this section, I feel that when a staff person goes above and beyond, they should be recognized. Linda has done just that. She is working very hard to keep the preschool going strong, handling a myriad of challenges with professionalism and skill. But more than that is what she is doing to reach out to our preschool parents. This is what God has called us all to do, but Linda is really making that happen. I continue to hear great things from the parents about how much that love our preschool.
2. **Brandee Iannelli:** She works with the youth, leading Sunday morning CrossTraining class, she is the Quarterlife leader (Bible study, fellowship, service), she organizes and leads the mission trips to Baton Rouge (preparing for the 3rd one), she spearheads the Operation Christmas Child boxes, she is part of the Women's Ministry Team, serves on the Praise Team on Sunday morning and there are probably many more things she is involved in and all while working a full time job! If every member of our church were to give like Brandee, God's command to love others would be going strong in our church and it would be a place that non-Christians would love to come.
3. **Volunteers:** Our church, in doing God's work, functions primarily on the basis of members volunteering to help and/or lead. There are many people in our church, whom I have not recognized specifically, who understand this function. Just stop and think for a minute about all the functions...dinner, potlucks, worship services, maintenance, lands & grounds, leadership, small groups, Bible studies, fellowship, etc. which would not happen without volunteers. You give so much of your time serving and you don't work for recognition, but only because of what Christ did on the cross for all of us. My hat goes off to all of those volunteers and I just say THANK YOU, from the bottom of my heart.....


On the left side of the newsletter you will see curricular objectives that these activities help promote among the kids. Learning for kids happens all the time!

PRESCHOOL REGISTRATION—Enrollment has started for the 2017-2018 school year! Congregation members and current preschool families are enrolling now. Enrollment packets can also be picked up at the children's ministry booth in the church lobby. An \$80 enrollment fee must be paid at the time of enrollment to secure a child's space. Registration for the community opens on February 13. Please spread the word to your friends, family, and neighbors that we have a wonderful preschool program and we can't wait to share God's love with each child that walks through our doors!

February—A month of Love

We are building relationships in pre-school of mutual trust and respect with others, including peers and adults.



On Tuesday, February 14th, the preschool classes will celebrate Jesus' love with their Valentine's Day parties. Our super supportive parents help in the classroom with all the party fun!

The preschool children will also have a fun morning with their dads or a special person on February 23 or 24. These days are set aside as "Donuts for Dads". The dads get to come in the morning to enjoy a donut with their child and do some other fun activities. It's a great time!

Also coming up....be watching for church mice! Church mice????? The preschool kids want to share their love with others by making special church mice. They will hide those in church and one Sunday (I can't tell you when, it's a surprise!) you will find church mice hiding all around the sanctuary. If you find one, you get to keep it! Tuck it in your Bible as a bookmark to remember the love Jesus has for you and how the preschool children enjoyed sharing that love with you as well!!!

There are many curricular objectives covered at lunch:

Using fine motor skills with purpose and control.

Personal Care Routines: Feeding

Participates in prayer

Participating in events helps us learn responsible conduct as a group member

Cooking in the home helps us learn math skills of measurement, comparisons, using number to show quantity, and learning the passage of time.

Children are exploring and investigating physical properties of objects and materials and solving problems.

Special events such as this build family relationships and memories that last a lifetime.

Singing in church helps with worship development as we praise God with song and participate in prayer.

Coming to church develops a sense of spirituality and knowledge of Jesus.

Lunch Time!

Did you know we eat lunch upstairs in the gym at child-sized tables and chairs??? Did you know we also serve our lunch family style???? That means the children are learning how to use their manners to have food passed to them, how to scoop out their own food from the serving bowls, take their entrée using tongs, and how to pour their own milk. Yes, even our two-year-olds are quite successful, with assistance!! We use child-sized pitchers and cups and the kids are doing great. The children are learning to take a certain amount of portions, such as 3 apple slices or even cutting or pulling a food apart and getting two parts or one half. We also learn how to sit the correct way in a chair, how to talk to our friends during the meal and when we are done, waiting for our friends to finish, and how to put our cups, forks, and plates in the correct tubs for them to be washed. There are so many skills to be learned while eating family style! Here's one of the prayers we say before lunch and snack (sung to the tune of the Johnny Appleseed song):

Oh, the Lord is good to me
And so I thank the Lord
For giving me the things I need
Like the sun and the rain and the apple seed
The Lord is good to me.

Chili/Soup/Dessert Cook-off!

Our annual Chili Cook-Off was another success!! We raised \$1,362 to go towards the purchase of a Smartboard for a third classroom. We are about half way there to actually purchasing one and all the materials/labor to have another board in our Monkeys class. Thank you for your generous donations, whether it was hot dogs, chips, cheese, or making a yummy pot of chili or soup or a delicious dessert, we all worked together, worshiped together, and came together for God's precious children.

Science Night!!

Our children will enjoy a night of Science with their parents on Thursday, March 2. Lots of fun learning activities will be set up in different stations. Feel free to bring your child or grandchild and join in on the fun. More information to come!

Grandparent's Day!! This is such a special event!! We start things by inviting our grandparents to church with us on Sunday, March 12 for the 11:00 worship service. All the preschool children will sing during the service. The fun continues on Monday, March 13 when the grandparents come to preschool. The grandparents will have a picture taken with their preschooler (and get to take that picture home with them that same day) and then worship with him/her in chapel led by Pastor Mike. After chapel everyone goes into the gym for a snack and reception time and the morning ends with grandma and grandpa taking their grandchild back to the classroom. This is a day to be cherished!

Mark your calendars for upcoming events:

Sunday, April 9: Easter Eggstravaganza and Palm Sunday—It's going to be bigger and better this year! Watch for more details!

Saturday, April 29: Trike-a-Thon for St. Jude Children's Hospital. Come join our preschoolers and their families as we have fun on the bike paths, go for a neighborhood bike ride and "parade", enjoy a hot dog lunch, have fun in the bounce house, and some friendly competition among the Church ministry staff all while raising funds for St. Jude.

Jesus Time

During this special time each child is learning the same Bible story over the course of one week. On Monday, Ms. Cari goes into the classrooms and teaches the lesson. On Tuesday, the entire preschool goes into the church sanctuary and Pastor Mike leads us in chapel. On Wednesday, Mr. Mark, our Director of Christian Education, goes into the classrooms to teach the same lesson again. On Thursday, it's Mrs. Huning's turn to teach. Each classroom teacher finishes the week with one last review of the lesson. Each month there is a theme and different Bible stories. 
