

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

I write to you this month asking for patience. Patience is always needed in life especially in times of transition. With the congregation approving a new governance model, we will all need a little patience as we slowly convert to this new system. For those of you who serve in special areas of ministry, from donut hour to harvest home, etc., your service is still needed. Some of our current ministry titles and how reporting is done will change, but your area of ministry is still important to Our Savior. Please bear with your new Leadership Board as things get flushed out over the next few months.

One of the first things we will be working on is creating a process that helps us fulfill our vision. So, with that said... we need to create a vision... as well as a process that leads to the fulfillment of that vision. Sounds simple, doesn't it? Well, Jim Galvin, our governance coach, is assisting us in creating policies to help us be more effective in ministry. He is also helping us look further down the road to see what we could look like once this governance model is fully implemented. Jim recommended we read a book called "*Simple Church*" by Thom Rainer and Eric Geiger. So what does a simple church look like? Below is an excerpt from page 60:

Here it is. Here is the definition for a simple church:

A simple church is *a congregation designed around a straightforward and strategic process that moves people through the stages of spiritual growth.*

This definition has some weight to it.

Let's walk through the definition one phrase at a time.

The church is *designed*. It is not carelessly thrown together. It is not haphazardly planned. The ministry does more than "just happen." It is thought-out. It is structured. It is designed with care.

Also, it is designed *around*....

The design of the church is centered on something. The programs and ministries revolve around something. They are just not plugged into the church calendar and brochure. Everything is designed around something. And that something is not a nebulous abstract concept. The design for discipleship in a simple church revolves around a process.

A simple church is designed around *a straightforward and strategic process.*

The process is *straightforward*. It is not confusing, it is easy to grasp. The leaders know it, and the people understand it.

The process is intentionally kept simple. It is not lengthened. It does not change every few months.

The church sticks to the simple process. Complexity is not welcome. More programs are not added to the process. The church rejects the multitude of new programs and models offered to it.

Since the process is the *how*, it is also *strategic*. The process is tied to the purpose or vision of the church. The two are closely knitted. The process is built for execution, to impact people. It is designed to be sequential so that people may move through the process.

The process *moves people*...

The simple and strategic process promotes movement. The process flows logically. People are attracted to Christ and the church and then are moved to points of attachment. The programs are used as tools to promote this movement.

And the movement through the straightforward and strategic process has an intentional and intended end result...


The process moves people *through the stages of spiritual growth.*

The goal is to partner with God to move people through the stages of spiritual growth. Changed lives are the bottom line, the intended end result. Christ formed in people is the goal.

A simple church understands that people are at different places in their spiritual journey, that spiritual growth is a process. The church is designed to partner with God to move people through stages of spiritual growth.

Sadly, most churches miss this truth.

They are not simple. They have not designed a simple process for discipleship. They have not structured their church around the process of spiritual transformation. And they are making little impact.



Our Savior doesn't want us to make little impact. He desires us to do immeasurably more than we ask or imagine (Eph. 3:20). Therefore we begin our simple journey with patience and hope. In our next Scroll article we will spend some time looking at the simple church model as it pertains to our MAT's (Ministry Action Teams).

Until then and beyond. Blessings in our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

Enrollment packets can also be picked up at the children's ministry booth in the church lobby. An \$80 enrollment fee must be paid at the time of enrollment to secure a child's space. Please spread the word to your friends, family, and neighbors that we have a wonderful preschool program and we can't wait to share God's love with each child that walks through our doors!

April-A Time to Worship and Celebrate Easter

Sunday, April 9: Palm Sunday and Easter Eggstravaganza—



We will celebrate our Lord's triumphant entry into Jerusalem on Sunday, April 9, 2017. Preschool kids will join JAM kids and wear Biblical clothing and have their own palm branch. We will go outside at 10:30 am and share our joy with the community by waving our palm branches, shouting Hosanna, and waving to passers-by letting them know we are celebrating Palm Sunday. At the 11:00 am service all the kids will participate in a special palm parade and worship song in the sanctuary. The fun continues at 12:00 pm with lunch in the gym and the famous egg hunt after lunch! We hope to see you there celebrating with us! By the way, if you'd like to wear an adult costume, let Ms. Cari or Mrs. Huning know and we can arrange that! Everyone gets a palm branch!

The Monkey, Giraffe, and Cardinal classes will have their Easter celebrations during the school day on Thursday, April 13. The Lion class celebrates on Tuesday, April 18.

Our preschool is closed Friday, April 14 and Monday, April 17 in celebration.

We are building relationships in pre-school of mutual trust and respect with others, including peers and adults.

There are many curricular objectives covered at lunch:

Using fine motor skills with purpose and control.

Personal Care Routines: Feeding

Participates in prayer

Participating in events helps us learn responsible conduct as a group member.

Special events such as this build family relationships and memories that last a lifetime.

Children are using gross motor skills with purpose and coordination.

Children are also practicing healthy and safe behaviors.

Adults are collaborating with others to ensure adherence to the safety of children.

Coming to church develops a sense of spirituality & knowledge of Jesus.

Singing in church helps with worship development as we praise God with song and participate in prayer.

Did you know we eat lunch upstairs in the gym at child-sized tables and chairs??? Did you know we also serve our lunch family style???? That means the children are learning how to use their manners to have food passed to them, how to scoop out their own food from the serving bowls, take their entrée using tongs, and how to pour their own milk. Yes, even our two-year-olds are quite successful, with assistance!! We use child-sized pitchers and cups and the kids are doing great. The children are learning to take a certain amount of portions, such as 3 apple slices or even cutting or pulling a food apart and getting two parts or one half. We also learn how to sit the correct way in a chair, how to talk to our friends during the meal and when we are done, waiting for our friends to finish, and how to put our cups, forks, and plates in the correct tubs for them to be washed. There are so many skills to be learned while eating family style! Here's one of the prayers we say before lunch and snack (sung to the tune of the Johnny Appleseed song):

Oh, the Lord is good to me
And so I thank the Lord
For giving me the things I need
Like the sun and the rain and the apple seed
The Lord is good to me.

Parent/Child/Teacher Conferences

Did you know we have Parent/Teacher Conferences in Preschool? That's right! On Monday, April 3 and Tuesday, April 4, the lead teachers will hold conferences in the morning and then again in the evening. Our teachers follow the Missouri Early Learning Standards and have also been trained and use a developmental assessment tool to track progress. Conferences give the teachers a chance to show each parent the growth their child has made over the course of the school year. It also gives the parents and teachers a chance to discuss next steps for learning. Another exciting part of this process is involving the child in this conference. The children will share their portfolio of "work" they have done throughout this past school year.

Trike-a-Thon

Our annual Trike-a-Thon is set for Saturday, April 29 starting at 10:00 am. Our preschool has been participating in this event to benefit St. Jude Children's Hospital for at least 20 years! Come join our preschoolers, JAM kids, youth, and their families as we have fun on the bike paths, go for a neighborhood bike ride and "parade", enjoy a hot dog sack lunch, and have fun in the bounce house. The Pedal Your Faith group will join us, inviting preschool parents to participate in a special bike ride through the community as well. The Youth Group will judge the winners of the best decorated bike and the coolest helmet. There will even be some friendly competition among the preschool staff all while raising funds for St. Jude. You won't want to miss this!

Intruder Awareness Course

The preschool teachers train, prepare, and have drills with our kids for bad weather and negative conditions. A major responsibility of our job is keeping God's precious little ones safe even in the event of an intruder or dispute in our building. Our preschool staff attended a 4 hour training on Saturday, March 25 to prepare for these negative conditions involving others. The staff gave their time to be educated and trained in the best safety procedures. We pray these conditions never happen, but now we are empowered in case they do.

Jesus Time

During this special time each child is learning the same Bible story over the course of one week. On Monday, Ms. Cari goes into the classrooms and teaches the lesson. On Tuesday, the entire preschool goes into the church sanctuary and Pastor Mike leads us in chapel. On Wednesday, Mr. Mark, our Director of Christian Education, goes into the classrooms to teach the same lesson again. On Thursday, it's Mrs. Huning's turn to teach. Each classroom teacher finishes the week with one last review of the lesson. Each month there is a theme and different Bible stories. The theme for April is "Praise and Easter" and the theme for May is "Easter and Jesus' Return".
